




IDEA INTO ACTION

How a charity basketball game turned into a first-class Boys & Girls Club

How it began

In 2018, Champion's President & CEO Brian Yeager set up a friendly charity basketball match between Champion and another multifamily developer Crawford Hoying. The location was to be the original Boys & Girls Club in the Milo Grogan neighborhood of Central Ohio, and the losers would donate to the organization of the winners' choice. Champion won that day and actually matched Crawford's donation to Boys & Girls Clubs of Columbus for a total of \$50,000 donated that day.

But that game would lead to much more than a \$50,000 donation. The event opened the eyes of Brian Yeager and Michelle Yeager to the condition of the 65 year old clubhouse. Basketball rims were bent, paint was peeling, and the facilities needed some serious upkeep that was hard for BGCCO to find funding for. After some serious consideration between Brian, Michelle, and BGCCO to renovating the clubhouse it was decided-- renovating wasn't enough. These kids deserved a brand new, state-of-the-art facility that would serve the neighborhood for decades to come. An idea was set into action.

"It's an exciting day, we're demolishing our oldest club in Boys and Girls Clubs of Central Ohio," said Doug Wolf, the CEO of the Boys and Girls Clubs of Central Ohio.

Built in 1955, the Boys and Girls Club in the Milo-Grogan neighborhood needed an upgrade. "It will have spaces for each of our age groups, it will have a state of the art gym, it will have a media center so we can project movies and programming on to a wall," said Wolf.

Setting a new standard

At 24,160 sq. ft., the new Champion Companies Milo Grogan Club truly sets the standard for Boys & Girls Clubs locations across the country. The children of the neighborhood now get to enjoy an NCAA-sized basketball gym, classrooms for different age groups, art and multimedia spaces, and even an outdoor space for a community garden. In addition to these incredible amenities for the children, the new clubhouse is also now the headquarters for Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Ohio. Never before had the organization been able to share a space with the children they serve, but with this new facility, they can now work and have meetings while looking out over the children playing in the gym, or attending art class.

While the initial fundraising goal for the project was \$13.5 million, the support from the community far exceeded those expectations and the final result was an astounding \$15.3 million raised.

The funds raised will help finance capital and operational/ programmatic investments for the longevity of Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Ohio and the important work they are doing in the community.

Grand opening

Champion donated a lead gift of \$2.5 million to start the project, and then spearheaded the fundraising, design and construction efforts for the new club. The larger Central Ohio business community responded to the fundraising call through the adversity of a global pandemic to make this dream a reality for the children of the neighborhood. In June 2023, with local and state leaders in attendance as well as steadfast supporters of BGCCO, the club was officially opened!


